### CCRR Update

Our Champaign County Roads Resurfacing project is proceeding along very wells. We completed the grinding and widening process by the end of August. We received bids for the paving on August 29. The contract was awarded to The Shelly Company of Belle Center, Ohio in the amount of \$1,326,668.50.

Currently we are repairing or replacing structures on the affected roads. We expect the entire project to be completed on schedule and all roads opened to thru traffic by November 4, 2002.

#### Safety Tip!!

A winter storm **watch** means that a winter storm is possible in your area.

A winter storm **warning** means a winter storm is headed for your area.

A **blizzard** warning means strong winds, blinding wind-driven snow and dangerous wind chill are expected.

You and your family should avoid unnecessary travel in a storm, but if you must travel here are a few tips to help keep you safe.

- Keep your car's gas tank full, this insures that you have plenty of gas for an emergency and helps prevent fuel line freezing.
- Let someone know your route, your destination and when you expect to arrive. If you get stuck along the way, help can be sent along your predetermined route.
- Prepare an emergency supply kit to carry in your car. Include extra clothing, boots, gloves, blankets, snacks, several small candles, matches and a flashlight.
